Thank you for sending us your old model PAUL (1965 version). We are pleased to say that our Spanish branch was able to perform a complete renovation, and you should shortly be receiving your new improved 1985 PAUL. We hope that it gives complete satisfaction; if not please return (within 14 days), with the original wrapping, and we will be pleased to reform it to the 1965 standard. We hope that the new streamlined appearance of the 1985 version meets with your approval, and also that the increased power-to-weight ratio will lead to increased product satisfaction. We regret that we were unable to reduce the PAUL's fuel consumption, indeed, the higher power output of the new version has, if anything, slightly increased fuel requirements. We have, however, been able to widen the range of acceptable fuel, to include items other than chips; an almost total conversion to liquid fuel has been accomplished (though slightly to the detriment of roadholding). A checklist of your new PAUL's modifications appears below.
