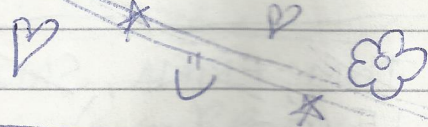

11th July - "Share's Shafts" bashing - Rich + ^{by}

"We have a lead that's not in the shaft bashing guide" enthused Share and Avelina.

Emi and I joined them and we set off with caring gear down the yellow path towards Extremor and to an entrance right on the border of area 5 and 10.

An obvious pothole about 10m diameter was descended* via a snow plug which had receded enough to continue. 2 leads at the bottom of the cone were fruitless and a third further left entailed down a boulder slope to a hole about 1m diameter in the floor that belled out.

First pitch ~ 15m, rigged with Y-hang off 2 naturals (big boulders) to a denotation the other side of the pit (natural, with buzzing sound, near a tree, we couldn't see the bees' nest).

2nd pitch Share bolted. "I have no idea what I'm doing" 3 bolts of traverse wire, in pretty flowstone walls then a Y-hang off a natural, glass formation + another bolt. "Oh shit, there's a spit and a shug in this underscaded line".

Turned out to be 29/5. We agree with Oluc that the rifts over the ledge below 2nd pitch can be pushed but probably needs tapping. Other side of the ledge (directly below Y-hang) the 'muddy pool' is now very clear but the walls close off. On way up the pit Avelina and I saw a rift with floor above the pool (following a fault) about 230' (towards 2/7)? [REVISI]

Fri 12th July - Shane's crack and Shane's crag by Rich T

Yesterday we saw a crack across Extremero from Shane's Shaft aka 29/5. I took a GPS approx bearing assisted by maps on smartphone and Graealon, Shane, Steve and I went to look for it. OUCG don't seem to have looked far, as the terrain is a bit rough.

Steve stayed down while the 3 of us went up and found what we thought was Shane's Crack below a tree, a no-go. Tried to climb above it but no go.

We went the other way, back towards camp. I saw a tree (trees means caves!) in the shade but no cave then heard Shane shouting "There's a draught!" By the time I was there rocks were being thrown. One moderately sized boulder was removed and a bigger one attempted, Shane's rigging. Sling became a digging sling.

We returned to camp, had 3 beers each waited for Roman aka Loco the raisin-loving donkey to bring up our digging kit and go. Let's go ^{Apple} ^{YEAT!} ^{swing}

I found 29/5 in the OUCG guide which matched our description perfectly including GPS location. This was back at camp where we found Steph, Ian and Eabha still not in Kivu "were going in at 9am tomorrow" - they didn't leave until 11:30 then Steph came back for a hair bobble then half an hour later Eabha came back for cones times. 9pm/1am on the hour and Ian - 11am. After 3 beers and a forecast of storms coming in, Roberto gave us a drastic look as a group of Irish and a couple of Yorkies - Shane, Gaelan, Steve, Brian, Jack, and I - headed off with explosives.

Once out Steve noticed a drastic change in the weather, clear skies had been replaced by cloud engulfing us and zero visibility. Shane went in for a poke and then the clouds started receding in the opposite direction.

14th July - Through Teresa and back (the day)

Having fully acclimatised to the mountain, to the point of having explored the areas around Sed 4 most thoroughly, Jack and I set off down the cave to see what could be found. Carrying some pink rope (that was definitely 9ml), and some other rope (which may or may not have been but probably wasn't), as well as other odds and ends for camp which we were to leave as far down as we got, we pranced cheerfully off to Xitu only to find upon arrival that I had, in a fit of extreme incompetence, forgotten my undersuit. Eventually we got below ground and, even with two relatively large bags, traversed the rift with surprising ease. The entrance series was both much drier and longer than I remembered, although recollections of dangling at various stages of upside down around the flake did come rushing back. My policy of not drinking to avoid the need to pee was not favoured by Jack, who would at various intervals stop and suck at minuscule puddles with his tiny magic straw.

Having made it to Customs Hall and dropped through to the upper streamway without incident, I swiftly got us lost in various dead-end mazy bits which ended only in puddles which Jack cheerfully drained. Following the carabide arrows that were obvious in retrospect, we toddled down to the streamway proper and bounced around there until hailed by voices from above. Far from the heavenly beings we had expected, it was Jeff and James, who were at least

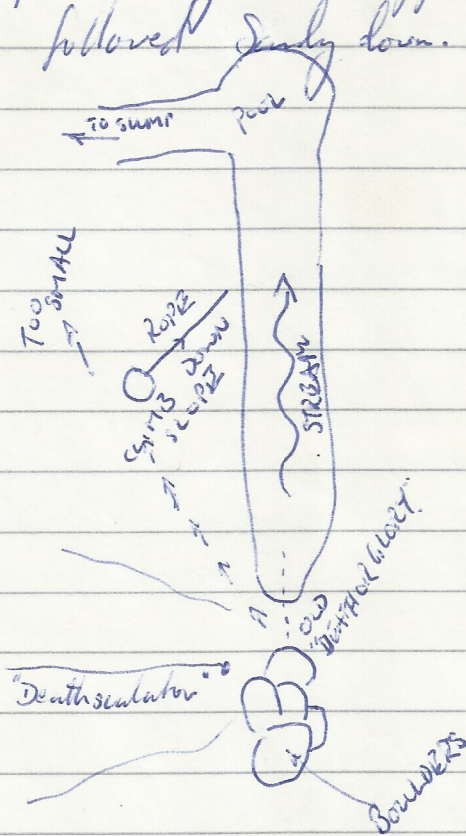

 aka: Team Swingers, Arlain + Sandy, Tom + Emma.

Carrying from Camp @ Hall of Mountain Jumps to top of Chunder Pit and rigging from Chunder Pit to end of the cave.
 Left camp ~ 2pm, arrived camp ~ 8:45pm, left camp ~ 9pm, arrived camp ~ 3:45am. Rigging down Classic Numbers straight forward until No. 7-9 where three ropes were found. These were used on the last three cascades: shortest first, longest tied to this as no belay could be found for the middle section and the middle length for the last cascade. Remaining cascades were free-climbed.
 Ropes for the "Death" series were all found in place and o.k. except for the last pitch of the cave: Death or Oberg. No descent belay for a deviation could be found so Tom started to put in a hand-belt (with much complaining), Sandy thought this might take a long time so went to look for a bypass. When he appeared at the bottom Tom lost enthusiasm for belting and rigged a handline down to the left of the pitch and followed Sandy down.

The camp was visited and exit made steadily to the camp.
