THE ARIO DREAM Spain Sistema Hitu -1,564 M F20, F80, and various draughting Cueva Culiembru shafts C3 / C4 (-644 m) 1,472 M ends in sumps likely 11km long, 1264m deep to link into upstream 2/7 2/7 (-811 m) 40th deepest in the world currently ends in major 1,264 M boulder choke. choke Egbert Xitu (-1,148 m) connected to Culiembro 2010 creating 1,264 m deep cave La Texa (-1,060 m) 1,800 m ~600m gap

Resurgence at altitude ~430m (water emerges at ~340 m) Major stream passage continues up towards 2/7...





Expedition Aims

- push pitch in Cave of the Singing Pasteur/Bill's Cave (27/9) could this be a sump bypass giving a dry route to Sistema Verdelluenga (C4)?
- revisit upstream in Cave of the Witches Eye (2/7, last visited in 1998, 1999, 2000) including
 - Canals on Mars (drysuits)
 - Full Moon Rising sump (dive)
 - high tube in Buy the Ticket, Take the Ride (bolt climb)
- connect Tras la Jayada to upstream 2/7 (Holier Than Thou)
- prospecting for new caves and re-visiting old caves



Connection from 27/9 to 2/7 (2023 - survey note from 2000)











Tras la Jayada >300m of entrance pitches














Skull Cave

First explored in the 1990s and "wide open by modern standards" (Tony Seddon) - a route into downstream 2/7?



Skull Cave Trips

- 17th Sandy, Dave capping, hammering Eft
- 20th Jean-Luc, Pauline, Jess capping, hammering Eft
- 21st Mark, Will capping, hammering Eft "rock is too hard to hammer and too soft to cap"

[Second half team arrives]

- 29th Michael, Tom, Fiona capping, hammering Eft
- 30th Michael, Tom, Rocky capping, hammering Eft and pitch head "In 1991 Tony Seddon must not have had bones or must have been able to defy gravity" Michael dropped the capping rod and mat down the pitch before it was enlarged enough. Tom got down by breathing out but failed to find the rod in 40 minutes of searching then spent about an hour making inch by inch progress getting less and less happy



Skull Cave Trips

1st - Michael, Tom, Rocky - capping, hammering

3rd - Ben, Tom - "minimal amount of effort"

4th - Alfie, Sophie - rigged below the squeeze but they "would suggest more capping" of the squeeze as 5 min to pass

5th - Kai, Steve, Philip, Eoghan - capping, hammering, Steve drops his descender

6th - Andrew, Steve, Rocky - capping, derigging "the tight pitch head is still too tight for most cavers"

Hidden Earth abstract

This summer we returned once more to northern Spain, to the warm welcome of the Refugio Vega de Ario, for a four week expedition. We quickly connected two significant caves. The massive shaft of Tras la Jayada was linked in to an upstream inlet of Pozu Jultayu, 2/7 (Cave of the Witches Eye). This allowed us to bid a - perhaps not so fond - farewell to our previous approach to this inlet via 27/9 (the Cave of the Singing Pasteur), which wasn't the widest. Now with a relatively easy and spacious way in we could fully equip an underground camp and access leads left decades earlier when this area was far more remote - an undived sump, an enticing hole high in a chamber and Canals on Mars, a deep water streamway. Hear what happened next and the work we did elsewhere - prospecting, re-exploring and some serious capping action.
